




FIP Developments to road system in the town centre

Review of Waverley Planning Applications

- One of the ways we can promote cycling, and indeed active travel generally, is to influence the planning process, particularly for larger developments, whether they are domestic or commercial.
 - This allows us to provide written input to the consultation phase of such developments, particularly about cycling infrastructure on the proposed site, the immediate access to the site, or its wider links into the local transport networks.

Funding: £386 grant from Cycling UK.


Media: 100s of leaflets in shops, 3 town centre banners, several Facebook paid campaigns, Herald articles.

The organisation's name is Farnham Cycle Campaign (FCC).


2 PURPOSES OF THE ORGANISATION:-

- to promote these means of transport to increase the health, safety and well being of these users;
- **3.** investigate and implement secure locations and amenities where cyclists can safely leave bicycles.

3 MEMBERS
